# 1 Use and Occupation of Lodge

#### 1.1 General requirements

There are numerous resources issued by government in relation to the COVID pandemic including general hygiene and individual protection. Members and guests are referred to the NSW Government Guidelines found at <a href="https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/stay-safe/rules">https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/stay-safe/rules</a> to keep up to date on any Covid related Government requirements. Members and guests are also referred to the NSW Health Fact Sheet – COVID-19 information for people in the NSW Snowfields attached to this Plan.

There are also appropriate cleaning products located in the stores. Professional cleaning services are also available through Bev Mills 0412 452 573.

#### 1.2 Attendance at Telemark lodge and action in the event of Covid positive case

- Members and guests are asked to stay at home if they are unwell and/or have Covid 19 related symptoms and they do not have a negative test result prior to their intended stay at Telemark.
- In the event of a member or guest testing positive to Covid 19 while staying at Telemark:
  - they are asked to leave the lodge as soon as reasonably practicable and return directly to their normal place of residence. Members and guests are asked not to self isolate in the lodge for the remainder of their booking but rather return directly to their normal place of residence;
  - while leaving the lodge and returning home, the infected person should use appropriate personal protective measures (ie, wear a facemask, gloves and stay 1.5 meters away from any other person) and follow the guidance in the NSW Health Fact Sheet COVID-19 information for people in the NSW Snowfields attached:
  - in the event a person is diagnosed at a time when they cannot immediately return home, they are asked
    to self isolate in an available room until such time as it is reasonably practicable for them to leave and
    follow the advice in the NSW Health Fact Sheet COVID-19 information for people in the NSW
    Snowfields attached;
  - any remaining guests are asked to ensure that all surfaces the infected person has come into contact with are disinfected:
  - please immediately notify a member of the Covid Committee identified below.
- The Covid Committee will consider on a case by case basis any additional deep cleaning requirements prior to the next booking entering the lodge.

### 1.3 Items not supplied

For the time being we will continue with the requirement for members and guests to bring down the following:

- Bed sheets and pillow cases (always the case)
- Doona covers
- Tea towels

### 1.4 Lodge cleaning

It is no longer a requirement to use external professional cleaners on departure. The usual strict cleaning requirements for Telemark departures are in place. Members and guests may still use the approved external

cleaner Bev Mills 0412 452 573 should they choose to do so. We attach a **Covid cleaning checklist** for guidance in respect of areas to be cleaned and disinfected prior to departure.

Members and guests are required to ensure the huts are left in excellent condition for the next guests including:

Sauna, sauna firebox and fireplace—Clean, place ash in STEEL garbage bins in T1 Woodshed garbage room, reset fireplace and sauna;

Woodshed - tidy

Bedrooms – leave doonas flat on beds, fold blankets and return to cupboards;

Refrigerators and Freezers – empty, wipe clean and leave open

Stove – clean oven, grill and stovetop thoroughly

Doors and windows – make sure all doors and windows are closed including internal doors.

## **COVID19 Pandemic Risk**

# Cleaning guidelines to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 based on Federal/State Guidelines, 2020

Method/Approach	Actions		
Ventilate rooms before you clean.	Allow fresh air to circulate for at least 20 minutes. If possible, leave all windows open during the entire cleaning process.		
Wash your hands thoroughly before and after each cleaning.	Use soap and water, and scrub for at least 20 seconds. If that's not possible, use a hand sanitizer with at least 70% alcohol.		
Wear disposable gloves while you clean.	Gloves should be thrown out after each cleaning. Make sure to wash your hands immediately after gloves are removed		
Clean, then disinfect.	Cleaning is when you use soap or detergent and water to remove dirt, germs and impurities.  Disinfecting refers to the use of chemicals like bleach or alcohol to kill germs. Doing both is the best way to reduce the spread of infection.		
Use the right disinfectant.	Diluted household bleach solutions, cleaning products with at least 70% alcohol, and most common disinfectants are believed to be effective against the coronavirus. Bleach is a strong chemical and care should be taken when using it.		
Focus on frequently touched surfaces.	Light switches, doorknobs, and tap handles are just a few of the areas you'll need to disinfect.		
Lounges and other soft, porous surfaces.	Carefully remove any visible dirt or grime, then use the appropriate cleaner for the material. If possible, machine-wash items according to the manufacturer's instructions.		
Clean Linen to be brought in and removed by guests each visit.	That includes sheets, pillow cases, pillow protectors, doona covers (or equivalent) as well as kitchen tea towels.		
Consider vacuum risks	Change vacuum filters every vacuum cycle.
